<p>We will:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Wash our hands before we eat/enter the dining hall • Use our manners at all times – please, thank you, pardon, excuse me, • Clear away trays and packed lunches – including putting rubbish in the bins • Sit carefully on our chairs to avoid accidents – 4 chair legs on the floor • Try different foods/eat our lunch, remain seated • Use our knife and fork correctly • Keep our lunch bands safe – on our wrists – avoid breaking them • Speak quietly to our friends – we do not need to shout inside • Enter the dining hall sensibly and quietly – one behind the other, walking and not pushing • Use kind words towards each other and adults • Be considerate and polite to everyone • Respond straight away and listen to an adult who has their hand in the air – child puts their hand in the air also • Walk around school sensibly and quietly 	<p>Article 24: Health and health services <i>Every child has the right to the best possible health. Children will be provided with good quality health care, clean water, nutritious food, and a clean environment and education on health and well-being so that children can stay healthy.</i></p>	<p>We will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide a range of healthy, tasty meals for children to choose from • Provide a clean, safe environment to eat in – clean tables/chairs, spillages, • Be kind and helpful – good role models • Encourage children to wash/sanitise hands on entering dining hall and before eating • Encourage good manners at the table and during lunch times • Reward good behaviour – positive play stickers/notelets home/house points • Encourage children to try different foods/eat lunch – children will never be made to eat all their lunch just encouraged to try to eat more/want • Be respectful to children and adults • Use appropriate hand signal to gain pupils attention – hand up in air • Talk calmly and appropriately • Pass on/Inform SLT of any issues/behaviour • Work together with parents/carers and class teachers to encourage children to eat healthy food

<p>We will:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Look after all equipment and let an adult know if it is broken or damaged • Use the equipment in the right way and not to hurt people with it or use as a weapon • Play together nicely – no rough play or hurting each other (Kind words, Kind hands, Kind feet) • Treat the environment and others with respect (includes trees, plants, adults, children) • Follow instructions the first time • Seek help from an adult when we feel we cannot deal with a situation – when we feel angry, upset, unfairly treated in a game • Coats Must be worn outside when cold/wet • Put away any equipment used in the equipment boxes • Line up sensibly and silently, one behind the other when the bell/whistle blows – end of lunchtime beginning of learning time • Wash our hands before returning to class 	<p>Article 31: Leisure play and culture <i>Every child has the right to relax, play and take part in a wide range of cultural and artistic activities</i></p>	<p>We will:-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Provide a range of fun activities for all children to participate in – with equipment and without equipment • Supervise and assist children when needed – incidents, accidents, friendship issues • Encourage good behaviour and manners on the playground (Kind words, kind feet, kind hands) • Be visible on the playground to children so they know who to go to if needed – hi vis jacket • Reward good behaviour – positive play stickers, notelets home, house points - praise • Help children to resolve any disputes – discussions & Restorative practice • Work together with the class teacher to encourage positive behaviour during lunchtimes • Offer alternative provision for children who feel overwhelmed during outside play – Heart Room, quiet activities, • Treat each child fairly – listen to all sides of the story • Pass on/inform SLT of any issues/behaviour
